Student Learning Outcomes:

This Chinese course is designed for students with advanced level Chinese language proficiency to move toward acquiring superior level language skills and improve their overall literacy in academic and professional Chinese. This course will be taught entirely in Chinese with authentic readings selected from a wide range of topics, including art, culture, economy, politics, literature, and current events. Students will improve their four skills through guided instruction and by focusing on acquiring language-learning strategies. The goals of the fours skills are:

- Listening 听: Students will be able to understand the main ideas and supporting details of extended discourse on topics of general interest. They will be able to derive essential points from oral texts such as descriptive texts, complex factual materials (e.g. news reports and summaries), and argumentative speech in areas of special interest. They will be able to use contextual clues and real-life knowledge to compensate for limitations in their lexical and structural control of the language.
- Speaking 说: Students will be able to communicate with accuracy and fluency on topics of personal, national, and international interest in formal settings. They will be able to explain concepts in detail, provide lengthy and coherent descriptions, formulate structured arguments, and discuss abstract matters related to their expertise or interest. They will be able to employ strategies (e.g., circumlocution and simplification) to avoid breakdowns in communication.
- Reading 读: Students will be able to understand the main ideas and supporting details of lengthy descriptive and argumentative texts using textual clues and various reading strategies such as scanning and skipping. They will be able to understand texts from various genres, especially news reports, editorials, and texts of professional and academic nature.
- Writing 写: Students will be able to describe objects in detail and write in-depth summaries. They will be able to present their opinions with supporting details in structured argumentative essays that feature specialized/formal vocabulary and complex sentence structure.

出勤与课堂参与 Attendance and Participation: Attendance is mandatory and extremely important. Unexcused absences will have a negative impact on your grade. Excessive absenteeism will result in a significantly lower grade. After two absences, students' grades will be lowered by half a grade. An excused absence will be granted only if the instructor is contacted prior to class with explanation and documentation provided. Students are responsible for any in-class announcements or materials that they miss during an absence. Coming to class well-prepared is essential to your learning. Active participation is also important. Speak up in class and engage in the discussion. The instructor will give a score on your attendance and participation for each class. The scoring criteria are as follows:

4 pts: well prepared, excellent participation/performance

3 pts: well prepared, good participation/performance

2 pts: some evidence of preparation / moderate participation

1 pt: present but unprepared

0 pt: absent

作业 Homework: homework, including preview and review homework, is to prepare students for the content of next class sessions or help students review what they learned in previous classes. All homework must be turned in on the due day. <u>Late submissions will NOT be accepted unless valid written excuses are provided before the deadlines and approved by the instructor.</u>

小考 Quizzes: Quizzes are designed to assess students' mastery of what they have learned in previous classes taken. There will be no make-up quizzes unless valid written excuses are provided and approved by the instructor before class.

虚拟工作体验 Virtual Workplace Experience: This is designed to prepare students for the Chinese-speaking work environment and help students develop professional skills. Students will apply for a job

at a virtual company called Green Ideas - from submitting a resume and cover letter to job interviews, to working with team members on projects, this online environment simulates what students will experience in the real world.

口语练习 **Speaking Tasks**: The purpose of speaking tasks is to help students improve oral fluency and provide opportunities for students to practice advanced level speaking functions, e.g., expressing abstract ideas, describing and narrating in connected discourse. Speaking tasks include presentations, oral reports, in-class recordings, debate, and discussions. Students are expected to prepare for these tasks before class. Task requirements and rubrics will be provided beforehand.

论文 Essays: Students will write three essays throughout the semester. The topics of these essays are related to the course content. Each essay should be at least 1000 characters. Grades of the essays are based on student efforts (e.g., content, word choice, sentence structure, coherence and organization, tone/voice, and format). For each essay, students should submit their first digital draft to the instructor via Canvas. After receiving written and oral feedback from the instructor, students need to revise the essay and submit their second draft via Canvas. Both drafts will be graded. Requirements for each essay will be uploaded to Canvas later this semester.

研究項目 Research Project: Students will design a research project that is of their own interest and related to the topics covered in this course or the content course CHN 470. Students will complete the following sections of the project under guidance: project blueprint, introduction, main body, conclusion / final products. Students should upload their drafts to Canvas. Written feedback will be provided after students complete each section. Students need to revise and re-submit the section along with the next section. The instructor will also provide oral feedback for students if needed. The Research Project should be at least 2000 characters. More detailed requirements for the Research Project will be uploaded to Canvas later this semester.

期末考试 Final Exam: The final exam will include multiple choice questions, short answer questions, filling in the blanks, essay questions, etc. The content of the exam includes everything covered in the course.

附加分 Extra Credit: Students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities/events related to Chinese. Details will be posted on Canvas.
