*Korean 205 and 305 are accelerated versions of 201-202 and 301-302 respectively, and are each counted as two courses.

NOTES:

- 1) Students may take up to two 200-level language courses (201 (4) and 202 (4), or equivalent)
- 2) Students must take at least three 300+ courses from the approved course list (check with the department).
- 3 All five courses must be taken for a letter grade, and must be passed with a grade of 'C' or better. In addition, the GPA for the five courses together must be 2.5 or higher.
- 4 All courses must be taken within the University of Hawaii system (with at least three taken at UH-Manoa), or else through a study abroad or exchange program which is directly administered by an official UH-Manoa organ (e.g., the Study Abroad Center, the Center for Korean Studies, etc.) and which is officially recognized by the Korean Section of UHM's Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.
