3. Students who test out of required courses (e.g., 401, 402, etc.) must take additional courses from Section II, Section III, or Section IV for each required course they test out of. These additional courses will be selected upon consultation with the Academic Advisor.
4. All Korean majors are required to consult with their faculty advisor or the Academic Advisor (in Moore 390) prior to registering for each semester. Also, all students contemplating application into our graduate program are advised to discuss their plans with their advisor(s).
