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NOTES:

1. Students may take up to two 200-level language courses.
2. Students must take at least three 300+ courses from the approved course list (check with the department).
3. All five courses must be taken for a letter grade, and must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. In addition, the GPA for the five courses together must be 2.5 or higher.
4. All courses must be taken within the University of Hawai'i system (with at least three taken at UH Manoa), or through a study abroad or exchange program directly administered by an official UHM organization (e.g., the Study Abroad Center, the Center for Korean Studies, etc.) that is officially recognized by the Korean Section of UHM's Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.
