

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MINOR IN KOREAN

NOTES:

1. All courses must be taken for a letter grade, and each must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. In addition, the GPA for all courses together must be 2.0 or higher.
2. Native speakers of Korean are not allowed to take language skills courses, so they must take all 15 credits from Section II (A Non-Language Skills Courses).
3. All courses must be taken within the University of Hawai'i system (with at least three taken at UH Manoa), or through a study abroad or exchange program directly administered by an official UHM organization (e.g., the Study Abroad Center, the Center for Korean Studies, etc.) that is officially recognized by the Korean Section of UHM's Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.
