NOTES:

- 1) Prerequisites for all Chinese courses must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. They may also be waived with the consent of the instructor.
- 2) All courses must be taken for a letter grade, and each must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. In addition, the GPA for all courses together must be 2.0 or higher.
- 3) Native speakers of Chinese are not allowed to take language skills courses, so they must take all 15 credits from Section II (Non-Language Skills Courses).
- 4) All courses must be taken within the University of Hawai'i system or through a study abroad or exchange program directly administered by an official UH Manoa organization (e.g., the Study Abroad Center, Manoa International Exchange, etc.), with at least three courses taken at UHM.
